Barley Parish Council

The PC meeting was dominated by discussions regarding car parking and congestion issues within the village that are occurring on a more regular frequency. Over 35 residents attended the meeting to consider ways of improving the situation. As you are aware the PC put out no parking cones through the village on special event days but the problems are now occurring unrelated to special events and are difficult to predict. Over the Xmas and New Year period we had three or four days when the village was saturated with visitors.

The Council have introduced single white hazard road lines at each end of the village but these are often ignored by inconsiderate drivers when the village is busy. The PC has also improved the parking lay by on Barley Lane to attract more walkers to this location.

The residents in attendance, on a show of hands. unanimously voted for double yellow lines and more hazard lines to be introduced to control the parking problem. The County Councillor and the Borough Councillor were at the meeting and agreed to promote road lines as a possible solution with the highway authority, Lancashire County Council (LCC). Only LCC are able to progress traffic regulation orders relating to the application of yellow lines and their enforcement with parking fines.

The chairman reported that LCC will only introduce yellow lines where there is an existing injury accident record, improve strategic traffic management, promote economic growth or provide significant environmental improvement. He felt Barley might not satisfy these criteria and pointed out that, even if an application was successful, it would take months to achieve.

Residents also raised a number of issues including stopping others promoting the village, introduce higher car parking charges, extend the car park and improving off road parking.

The actions agreed included to continue to put out no parking cones until a road lining solution could be agreed with LCC. The chairman reported this relied on volunteers and second guessing when the village would be busy generally sunny days. The cones would not be put out every weekend as this was not necessary; the problems did not arise every week and the main problems came from inconsiderate drivers. The introduction of parking restriction road lines would be requested of LCC with councillors exerting any influence they can. The car park would also be improved to encourage full use.

The parking issues were linked to the PC's current consideration of introducing CCTV at each end of the village and it was felt the cameras will be a deterrent to criminals and those who park illegally at junctions or causing obstructions.

The PC would like to thank those residents who attended the meeting and expressed their views and to the Mayor, Cllr. James Starkie, for promoting the meeting and chairing a pre-PC meeting to gather and summarise views.

Goldshaw Booth Parish Council

I wish all the residents of Goldshaw Booth Parish a happy New Year and assure everyone that your Parish Council will continue to meet the challenges that 2019 will bring.

I am delighted to announce that the vacancy for a parish councillor has been filled by Beccy Murrell from Sabden Fold. This is the first time a representative from the hamlet has been a councillor for some time and Beccy has already made a positive contribution.

The main event of the year will probably be the development of Spenbrook Mill by Cheshire Estates, which is planned to start in the springtime. There will be the disruption that the building work will bring but at completion of the development I hope it will be one that we can all be proud of.

Mr Lawrence Daw of Cheshire Estates has agreed to attend our next Parish Council meeting, which is open to the public, where he will give details about how the building work will progress and he will be able to answer questions about any concerns anyone has.

The meeting will be held in St Mary's school on Tuesday 12th February. I am sure many parishioners will be interested to attend and have this opportunity of finding out more about the development. We will be delighted to see as many people as possible but please be aware that depending on how many people turn up, it may be standing room only.

The following month at our Parish Council meeting on Tuesday 12th March, we will start to discuss how to best use the £28,000 that has been paid to Pendle Borough Council as part of the planning conditions for the development of Spenbrook Mill. The money is to be used for the provision of off-site public open space in the locality of the development. We will firstly have a presentation from Komplan Ltd, which is a play equipment supplier company, to give us their ideas, including how we could improve the play equipment in Newchurch recreation ground.

We welcome ideas from anyone in the parish about how this money could be spent and although we have asked for contributions from the public before, I think now is the time to get involved.

Please be assured that we will not take any decision about this money without careful consideration. It would be a good opportunity for parishioners to come along to the meeting in March to let us know your views.

I regret to announce that there has been criminal damage to council property in Newchurch. A chain securing a gate into the playing field has been cut repeatedly, presumably because the offender does not like the chain being there. The incidents have been reported as a crime and if we are able to positively identify the person concerned, the police will be involved and my personal hope is that criminal charges will be brought against them.

Residents will be aware that Douglas Hall Kennels lodged a planning application recently for change of use of dog breeding kennels to a mixed use of dog breeding, dog sales and dog petting (Retrospective) and formation of an extension to the existing car park. The application was fully discussed by the parish council and it was decided by a majority decision to object to the application. Chris Burt

Thanks to the Village Centre Committee and volunteers for organising a number of very successful festive events: The Christmas Fayre, the Christmas Boogie and the Senior Citizens Christmas Lunch. The Bay Horse had a busy time with a full house on both Christmas Day and New Year's Eve. The Investors AGM following the pub's first full year, received a very positive update, which is down to incredibly hard work by the Swarbrick family and staff. We wish them every success in 2019.

The Parish Council meeting in January included discussions on many on-going items, new projects and, importantly, the budget and precept for 2019/20. The state of our roads and the running surface water at the bottom of Pasture Lane give cause for serious concern. The County Council are taking steps to sort things out. A grant secured from the Pendle Hill Landscape Partnership will allow us to continue work to protect and enhance local habitats.

Although a small Parish we are responsible for the maintenance of our green areas and other facilities, such as bus shelters. We are required to show good administration and to be accountable in law and are obliged to appoint a Parish Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer who is paid by the Parish. All of this expenditure is financed via a precept, a small addition on the Council Tax. The amount required is set by the budget which was agreed at our January meeting. Due to higher costs this year, we have to increase the Parish precept by 4%, or just over £1 per year for a Band D property. The main increases are to the Clerks fees where we have a moral obligation to pay the Living Wage and provision for the Luncheon Club as a result of the loss of subsidy from the Borough Council. Overall our forecast budget has increased to £9497, compared with £8015 last year.

The other major concern for the Parish Council is the outline planning application for two houses on the field between Thorneyholme Hall and the bottom of Jinny Lane. This proposal has been the subject of objections by the Parish Council and many residents for several reasons and could open the floodgates to the development of similar sites in Roughlee and other Pendleside villages. In spite of well-presented objections, we were surprised to find that the application was being recommended for approval by the Planning Officer. The Parish submitted a petition to the Borough Council signed by 117 residents, a very high percentage.

The planning application was considered by the Barrowford and Western Parishes Committee. Prior to this meeting, the Parish Council and the Planning Officer held detailed discussions on why the application should be refused. The village petition was presented to the meeting by Simon and two highly eloquent presentations were made by villagers opposed to the scheme. In the event the refusal reasons were accepted unanimously by the Committee and the application was duly refused. I think this is a very good example of a Parish Council and residents acting very positively to protect our village and countryside.

Looking ahead to the summer, the Annual Meeting of the Parish, will be held, probably in June. This is the opportunity for residents to involve themselves in Parish matters so please let us know what you want us to include in the agenda. Andrew Walker
