Telegraph Poles - there is not much more to report other than BT Openreach has stopped erecting poles outside of the village but they are continuing wiring works within the village. We are now aware that the plans involved erecting over 200+ poles. The County Council, the Borough Council and the AONB are now leading on this matter and have held meetings with BT. I understand that BT now recognise the AONB status and are preparing alternative plans which will reduce the numbers of poles required, hopefully eliminating them from open vistas such as upper Ogden Valley. The Parish Council will continue to lobby for the delivery of superfast broadband whilst putting a strong case forward for cables to be buried underground or wireless technology to be used to minimise the visual damage of poles and cables in open areas.

At last we have got one of our Orientation Boards fixed to the wall on the car park toilet building. It includes a map of local footpaths around Pendle including the sculpture trail, a village map detailing local facilities and buildings of interest all complimented with snippets of local history, geology and local information. A second board will be erected in the spring.

The parish council website is now live and a vailable for you to peruse at www.barleyparish.uk. It is not the finished article as we are continuing to update it with Council and local information. Cllr. Starkie has helped us establish it and our Clerk, Vicky, is coming to terms with the skills required to manage the site and keep it up to date. Have a look.

Just had a trawl through Barley Past & Present and noticed a post from David Lyons who reports on his efforts to collect garbage discarded by walkers and drivers in to our hedges and verges. Well done David. Others I bump into collecting rubbish with bin bag in hand include Margaret Wilkinson and Richard & Karen Lewis - thank you on behalf of us all. I occasionally write about the cleaning fairies we must have and I know there are many more of you who pick up rubbish as they go about their business in the village. I mention these people because I happen to have seen them out there with the sole purpose of collecting rubbish and it deserves recognition. For those I have not seen - a big thank you to you too! Goldshaw Booth Parish Council

The Parish Council decided at its meeting on Tuesday 13 February to adopt a 'wish list' in order to give some longer term aims for projects. All councillors engaged in this idea and contributed to a list of jobs that we would like to attend to when time and money allow. For example, one councillor wanted to attend to the state of Sparable Lane just behind the churchyard and another to improving the flooring inside the toilet block in Newchurch. It is a long term aim to paint the railings on Nanny Maud Brow and one day this will happen. I invite residents to add to this wish list, which they can do by attending a Parish Council meeting. We will decide in the coming months which jobs have priority and how to allocate resources. I have written about this to show that the PC is looking forward and actively planning for the future and not to just reacting to events as they happen.

Last month I referred to a leak in a land drain in the playing field. Although I was hopeful that the job would be nearing completion by now I regret that this is not quite the case. Most of the water escaping from the land drain is now being diverted away from the playing field but a permanent fix cannot be implemented until we can get a digger in to the job. This will not be until the weather dries up for a while, so we are looking at Springtime before we can carry on. Please bear with us until then.

Residents may recall that I have been successful in obtaining a large number of 12 inch long saplings to plant in Sparable Wood from the Woodland Trust to replace the ash trees killed by Ash Die Back disease. These will be with us at the beginning of March and the PC has made a provisional date of Sunday 18 March at 10.30am to plant the saplings. Any volunteers who wish to attend will be welcome. St Mary's School will be involved and the head teacher, Mrs Nightingale, will arrange for the schoolchildren to plant some saplings on a school day separate to the main planting. I have asked Lee Johnson, the Senior

Environmental Officer of Pendle Borough Council to supervise the children and he has indicated that he would be delighted to be involved.

The development at Spenbrook Mill finally appears to be starting. There was a site visit recently where the councillors met with the owner and proposed builder to discuss the building materials to be used. Although a final decision was not made, I was impressed with the attitude of both builder and owner to building a high quality development. There are many conditions to be complied with before building starts but my hope is that the development is now in the foreseeable future.

Roughlee Parish Council

The month of March brings hope of Spring and the Parish Council are gearing up to improve our lovely environment.

The Friends of Roughlee Appearance group (FOR A) are organising an event as part of the National Operation Spring Clean which encourages local Councils and community groups to clean up their areas. Our annual litter picking and clean-up operation is arranged for Sunday 4th March and volunteers are asked to meet at 10am at the Village Centre. Gloves and other equipment will be provided along with a supply of butty's and coffee. Last year a huge amount of litter was collected, much of it hidden but still damaging to the environment. We hope to do as well this year so please come along if you can spare an hour or so.

Over the winter we have received reports prepared by Lancashire Wildlife Trust on habitats within the Parish. Details from these reports are displayed on the village website and show how our countryside has changed over time. There are also recording sheets where villagers are encouraged to list sightings of local birds, mammals, amphibians and plants. The idea is to build up a picture of our local environment to see how we can protect and improve valued habitats. We hope to organise local groups of interested people to take things forward. Support for this work will be sought from the Pendle Hill Landscape Partnership who have recently received significant lottery funding.

Following on from the successful programme of footpath stile improvements undertaken last year we are now looking to improve the riverside concrete retaining walls alongside the river opposite the Bay Horse using capital programme money from the Borough Council. A scheme for new planters and wild flower planting is envisaged. Also using capital programme funds we are hoping to do something to repair the damaged footpath at Thorneyholme.

Speaking of the Bay Horse it is pleasing to note that the pub has enjoyed a highly successful time since opening. If you haven't called in yet please help support this wonderful local facility.

As you will have noticed Openreach have been busy over the past few weeks installing Superfast Broadband in the village. This is now available to about two thirds of the houses in the village which

is very good news but the controversy relating to poles in the AONB still rumbles on. Led by Councillor James Starkie efforts are being made to keep poles to a minimum.

Finally, a note for your diary. The Annual Meeting of the Parish is scheduled for 7pm on Monday 11th June 2018. This is the occasion for all residents of the village to come together to hear reports on what is happening, to ask questions and to raise concerns. Following on from last year's very successful meeting we will be arranging for speakers on matters of interest and refreshments will be provided. It is your meeting so please make an effort to attend.
