The Vicar's Letter

In theory this edition of the magazine would have contained an Easter message with details of the extra services to be held at St Mary's Church but as Bishop Julian has said in his recent letter 'Our way of gathering may need to change for a season and that is right because it is done with the most vulnerable in mind.'

During Holy Week normally churches across the land would gather on the Thursday evening to remember Jesus' meal with his disciples where he took the role of a servant and washed their feet. (John 13:4-20) In services throughout the country people would meet and symbolically show their service to each other by washing feet. Due to the coronavirus there will be no foot washing and indeed no public acts of worship this year.

But as the Archbishop's of York and Canterbury have said this does not mean that the Church of England has shut up shop. As they said, 'Our life is going to be less characterised by attendance at church on Sunday and more characterised by the prayer and service we offer each day'.

In John 13: 34 -35 Jesus says, 'And now I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. If you have love for one another, then everyone will know that you are my disciples'.

Now more than ever it is the time for us to put this commandment into action remembering the wise words of Archbishop Temple that the church is the one organisation that exists for the benefits of its 'non-members'.

Whilst observing the restrictions we will endeavour to open St Mary's Church for private prayer when we can.

The response to Coronavirus is constantly changing. The most recent government advice asks us to self-isolate for 14 days if you or a member of your family, who live with you, have a new continuous cough OR a high temperature (37.8 degrees or higher). Avoid non-essential contact and work from home if it's possible.

These actions will help protect others in the community whilst there is a risk of infectious. Rather than relying on social media, for up to date reliable information and advice visit the gov.uk websites dedicated pages. This is a worrying time and the coming weeks are going to be very disruptive. We all must pull together during this time and don't be afraid of asking for help if you need it from a neighbour, friend or contact the Parish Council for assistance.

In recent weeks The Rt Hon Rishi Sunak MP gave us his first budget as Chancellor. Seen as a positive investment budget we see more than £600bn investment being spent on transport, infrastructure and housing. £5bn of this fund has been allocated to renewed efforts of bringing broadband to rural communities as well as £2.5bn being made available to fix potholes and resurface roads in England over the next 5 years. Some good news for people living in rural communities, who have to rely on their car, is that fuel duty has been frozen for the 10th consecutive year.

Although given approval approximately 12 months ago we still wait for the installation of road lines in the village. We realise that the weather has been against us in recent months but be assured the Parish Council are putting constant pressure on LCC to complete these works as a matter of urgency.

We have submitted our application for this year's Best Kept Village Competition and ask that if there is any group, business or person who would like to get involved and take on responsibility or sponsor some work please contact a member of the Parish Council. We already have 4 volunteers and could do with a few more.

A planning application for the renovation of the derelict Manknowles farm building on Barley Hill has been approved after the third submission. The Council had objected to the previous applications because the design was not in keeping with the AONB but we were pleased to eventually see design features conditioned in to the application. We look forward to witnessing this fine building, overlooking the village, being restored.

If you get chance to look at the Facebook Barley Residents website, there are links to a video called "Old Pendle" which was made in 1974 by John Rickard, a Burnley based film-maker whose work captured evocative memories of the area. Well worth watching.

It is with sadness that I report the passing of Eddie Ayres of Windy Harbour Farm.

Goldshaw Booth Parish Council

The Parish Council has secured a grant from Barrowford and Western to purchase two defibrillators and protective covers, these will be situated in Sabden Fold and Spenbrook. Thank you to the residents who have agreed to have these sited on their properties. Thank you also to John Riley who has agreed to help with the installation.

The new Parish website has been redesigned by Councillor Cronshaw and is due to be launched shortly, it provides news and information relating to the three villages within the Parish.

Planning application (20/0119/PIP) to build four properties at the side and rear of Osborne Terrace was discussed at our last council meeting. All objections have been noted from residents and council members and these have now been forwarded to Pendle Borough Council. Details of the application can be found on the Pendle Planning website using the planning application number.

The gardener has been commissioned to create a rockery garden behind the bus stop and bench in Spenbrook.

Dog fouling continues to be a problem throughout the villages. The Parish Council has applied to Pendle Borough Council to affix several dog fouling notices throughout the area.

Blocked gullies continue to cause problems and the council has again requested for Lancashire County Council to deal with them. This is an ongoing issue.

In light of the current Coronavirus situation it has been necessary to cancel the tree planting, BKV Competition, Annual Parish Meeting and Council Meetings to avoid any group contact. The 500+saplings which have been obtained through the Woodlands Trust and Burnley Football Club in the Community will now be planted by council members in their own time.

Could I ask all members of the Parish during this current Coronavirus situation to be mindful of their neighbours especially the vulnerable and elderly and where possible please provide any help and support that may be required.

They also had great fun identifying species of trees from leaves and buds. We are very much looking forward to working with Alison again on school projects.

We held our first Rotakids event on 28th February - DRESS ODD DAY. We had lots of fun dressing oddly for school, even the children's parents joined in when they came to Celebration assembly. All the money raised will go towards new kitchen utensils for the Samaritan School in Uganda.

Roughlee Parish Council

I had intended that this news would have been full of announcements relating to our Spring programme of events. Coronavirus has now changed everything and the timing of future events is quite uncertain. This News is being written against a backdrop of rapidly changing Government advice but the Parish Council will continue to monitor the situation and to keep villagers informed via the website.

As the virus situation began to worsen it was decided to close the Village Centre to all events. Whilst this caused some concerns our overriding consideration was to protect vulnerable users, particularly the elderly who attend the weekly luncheon club. Subsequent events have, I think, justified the decision but the ongoing uncertainty is recognised.

The key events which are affected are the Parish Council Meetings on 6th April and 4th May, the VE day celebrations on 8th May and the Annual Parish Gathering on 1st June. If things improve and the events can be reintroduced or alternative dates found we will announce this in goodtime. Please keep an eye on the website. At the moment it is our intention that the formal business of the Parish will continue, if necessary electronically, so items of business can be referred to the Clerk whose contact details are on the back of the News.

Another casualty is the Annual Spring Clean which should have been held at the end of March. This has now been rearranged for September, details later. Also under threat is the Bay Horse pub which is so highly regarded by residents. At the time writing the pub is still open but it will need a great deal of support by all as things improve.

Clearly the next few weeks and months are going to be very difficult particularly for or older and more vulnerable residents. Whilst I am confident that neighbours will look out for each other the Parish Council will be looking at how we can help. The most obvious means is the website which we will use to keep you informed of local issues. For those of you who do not have easy access to the internet but have things requiring local help please contact the Clerk, Chairman or members of the Parish Council. Again contact details are on the back page of this News.

Finally may I wish you all good health and happiness. Let's hope that the virus gives Roughlee a wide berth. And remember, Spring will soon be here.
