

# The Vicar's Letter

## **Easter- A time for new beginnings**

The angel said to the woman, 'Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said' (Matthew 28:5.6).

There are times when life is filled with upheaval, challenge, grief and fear. We are all too aware of this at a time of continued uncertainty due to the Coronavirus yet amidst the worry there is hope.

For Christians that hope is found in Jesus and powerfully proclaimed each Easter morning with the words Alleluia. Christ is risen. Easter marks the time for new beginnings. The imagery of Easter is about new life and growth, this is why it was considered a good time to be baptised in the early church.

Easter is still considered a good time to be baptised. Baptism means 'to immerse' which is a wonderful representation of Jesus' death, burial and resurrection. We come up out of the water and we are a new creation. The old things have passed away, the new has come. This is why there is often a renewal of Baptism vows during an Easter Service.

When someone is baptised, they are given a candle which is lit from the Easter candle. The Easter candle reminds us that Jesus is the light of the world and not even death could extinguish this light.

When the Easter candle is lit for the first time these words are used. Praise the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ: he has given us new life and hope by raising Jesus from the dead. God has claimed us as his own: he has made us light to the world.

Christians are to walk in the light of Christ all the days of our lives not just on Easter Day.

In 2020 churches were closed on Easter Day yet this did not stop the people of God celebrating Easter they simply found new ways to proclaim Alleluia Christ is risen. Easter 2021 will be celebrated in church but we do not spend all our time in churches (not even Vicars!!) we are called to shine as lights in the world.

We are called to shine as lights to the glory of God in our homes, our places of work, our schools in fact anywhere and everywhere.

If you are able to please join us as we light the Easter Candle on Easter Day at the 9.30am service, if not you might like to light a candle of your own, maybe your Baptism candle, at some point during the day and use the prayer below.

However you celebrate the Risen Christ in 2021 may you be strengthened in faith, know the power of his presence and rejoice in the hope of eternal glory.


# The prime minister

## Goldshaw Booth Parish Council

As you are aware the Parish Council has undertaken a consultation process with regards to dog fouling in the children's play area in Newchurch. This took place over a two week period giving all residents the chance to have their say on the matter.

The feedback we received was that 14 residents. were in favour of a total ban and 4 residents were against the ban and suggested that dogs on leads should be the preferred option. All Councillors additionally supported the total ban, which would bring us in line with the rest of the Borough. Therefore, we have instructed the Community Protection Coordinator at PBC to begin the process of adding the play area onto the Public Space Protection Order that is currently in force. For the site to be added to the order this will need approval from the Barrowford & Western Parishes Committee, but we have been advised this should not be an issue, given that all other areas in the Borough are currently included in the order.

We have also been advised that as the election is due in May, the banning order will not be in place until June/July and PBC will provide the notices/signs to be displayed.

I know this may not be everyone's wishes but we undertook a democratic process and the majority decision is clear. Ultimately this is about our children being able to play safely within the play area. As we have always said the play area should not be allowed to become a dog toilet.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish you all a very happy Easter.

# Roughlee Parish Council

Today the sun is shining and it feels like Spring is definitely on its way. Coronavirus restrictions are soon to be eased and the village can gradually return to normality. Whose for a pint down the pub?

March 8<sup>th</sup> was a busy day for the Parish Council. At 6pm nearly 30 people logged on via ZOOM to enjoy a fascinating presentation on the history of Roughlee with particular reference to our industrial past. The presentation had been prepared by the Pendle Forest History Group, was delivered by Brian Jeffery and ranged from pre-history to present times. The whole presentation can be accessed on the village website and represents a really interesting way to spend an hour. Our thanks are due to the History Group for their hard work and enthusiasm.

The presentation feeds into the Roughlee Industrial Heritage Project for which we now have the necessary funding for the first phases. As reported previously we intend to restore a number of historical features and erect interpretation panels to help explain something of the village history. We hope to carry out works over the summer period.

The Parish Council also met via ZOOM at the conclusion of the history presentation. The main item of business was to receive a report on the emerging Pendle Local Plan Part 2 which, alongside the adopted Part 1 Plan, will guide development through to 2030. It is, therefore, of crucial importance to both Roughlee and the surrounding area. The Parish Council welcomes the main thrust of the plan which should provide enhanced protection for the AONB. We have raised two relatively minor points relating to the

village boundary and the distribution of new housing in Pendleside.

We also considered the Pendle Community Governance Review which will look at the structure and organisation of Town and Parish Councils in Pendle. We are recommending that the Parish boundaries remain unchanged but that the membership of the Council be increased from 7 to 9 to allow for a more diverse membership.

During the coming months we will be progressing the Heritage Project and Village Green designation as previously reported. So, quite a busy time ahead.
