## **Barley Parish Council**

The **Annual Parish Meeting** is scheduled for Wednesday 9th May and you are all invited to attend. We will be talking about improvements to the fabric of the village, a couple of important planning issues affecting us all including the lap dancing club, telegraph poles, balsam bashing and the steaming hot political topics.

Others will be speaking about events in the village and we will finish with fine wine and high-class nibbles, provided by a local business, and we provide you with the chance to catch up with those we do not see often enough and local gossip – come and join in, those who make the effort always enjoy it.

The Telegraph Poles and Superfast broadband project remains a mystery as to where this project is going, or not, next. BT have now indicated that they are not planning any more activity, under Contract 1, for the Pendle side premises where delivery was paused pending consultation (in line with BT's own Code of Practise) related to the AONB. BT have now achieved their contractual targets for Contract 1 and have no more connections to deliver.

BT have indicated that they would consider delivering the remaining premises under Contract 2 (currently live) but that is already oversubscribed so there is no guarantee of delivery and then they go on to talk about subsidies and alternative suppliers. Hopefully the picture will be clearer soon.

I saw another vehicle had ended up on its roof this week at the S Bend on Barley New Road. Not the first and the driver has reported an animal in the road had caused the accident. Too often I see drivers floor the pedal once they have reached the car park gate and speed off down the avenue treating the road as a race track through to Thorneyholme. It is not surprising how many lose control at the S Bend and I think it would be a recognised accident black spot if people did not pack up their troubles and leave asap before the police get involved. The Parish Council are currently improving a short stretch of the footpath to Pendle Hill starting from the village chapel up to the old sawmill. New stone has been laid and the landscaping tidied up and the area looks much better. Don't forget to come to our Annual PC Meeting to hear more about development plans. Derek Heap

### Goldshaw Booth Parish Council

It is my pleasure to start this month's newsletter with a report that the planting of the 420 saplings in Sparable Wood, which I referred to last month, was completed during the latter part of March. After the snow eventually stopped, pupils from St Mary's School were able to plant 50 saplings under the guidance of Lee Johnson, the Environment Officer from Pendle Borough Council. The children and the teaching staff enjoyed the experience greatly, which is good, as I hope to apply for another similar number of trees from the Woodland Trust next year, which will be planted in the same area. The remaining 370 saplings were planted by parish councillors and other volunteers from all three hamlets within the Parish. Although I thanked everyone at the time, I would like to repeat my thanks for what was a very successful morning. I hope residents were able to read about it in the Nelson Leader.

Work has started around the Parish after the weather relented and residents will have noticed that part of the concreted Sparable Lane in Newchurch has been repaired by Pendle Borough Council. The public footpath that connects Osborne Terrace to the playing field that runs alongside the sewerage works in Spenbrook used to flood after heavy rain and has now been dealt with. This involved 2 tonnes of hardcore and gravel being laid by volunteers, which has raised the level of the path sufficiently to avoid further flooding. Work is being carried out by a contractor to tidy up the playing field and will be finished shortly.

Residents will have noticed that work has started in Spenbrook Mill and we will have to get used to this being a building site for a long time to come. Hopefully the end result, after Spenbrook doubles in size, will be worth it.

A legal contract has been made between Pendle Borough Council and the owner of Spenbrook Mill under a section 106 agreement. This has resulted in a sum of £28,000 being paid to PBC by the owners of Spenbrook Mill which has to be spent within 5 years, on the condition it will be spent for the 'provision of off-site public open space in the locality'. It is an opportunity for the Parish Council to have an influence on how this money is to be spent and we would like to hear residents' views so they can also be presented to PBC. The Annual Parish Meeting, which will be held at 7.45pm on Tuesday 8 May at St Mary's School, is an ideal forum to hear your views. If you wish to have your say, please come along to the meeting. **Christopher Burt**

The drama club will provide the perfect opportunity for children to enjoy and benefit from a range of activities, including drama games, improvision, choral speaking, script reading and a performance at the end of term!

Our pupils were invited by Chris Burt, Chairman of the Goldshaw Booth Parish Council, to plant a large number of trees in Sparable Wood. The wood has been severely affected by Ash Die Back disease but our children helped to bring the wood alive again by planting saplings of holly, birch, oak and rowan. They were shown how to plant the saplings by Lee Johnson, the Environmental Officer at Pendle Borough Council, along with guidance from Mr Burt. They all had a great experience working together on the project.

Reception class invited their mums, dads and grandparents to join them in school for out termly 'Stay and Play' afternoon. They had lots of fun creating models of rockets and aeroplanes.

### **Roughlee Parish Council**

Perhaps the big news for May is the installation of James and Janet Starkie as Mayor and Mayoress of Pendle. Both have given long and valuable service to Roughlee Parish Council and to the Village Centre Committee. We extend congratulations and look forward to welcoming them back as the new first citizens of the Borough.

At the Parish Council meeting on 9<sup>th</sup> April we spent a significant amount of time discussing two old chestnuts, the delivery of Superfast Broadband and the prevalence of potholes on the village roads. County Councillor Christian Wakeford was at the meeting and was most helpful with updates on both items. However, the fact remains that much of the village is still experiencing difficulty with the Superfast connection and help from Openreach is in short supply. The Parish Council will be represented at a meeting where these problems will be aired and, hopefully, resolved. The work to deal with potholes is looking more promising, so, we live in hope.

Every Thursday Roughlee Parish Council host an over-60's **LUNCHEON CLUB** at the Village Centre. The cost is just £5 which includes a two course meal with tea and biscuits. Volunteers from the village provide the service and it is a good opportunity for a get-together for retired residents of the Pendleside villages. Unfortunately, numbers have dwindled in the last couple of years and we are now looking for new members.
