On Sunday 28th May in our service of Morning Prayer we paused in our worship and observed a minute's silence in respect of this tragedy and to thank God for the speedy response of the Emergency Services and for the care and support of so many people who rallied round to help, regardless of Race, Creed or Colour.

As we look forward to the warmer summer months when we can enjoy our beautiful surroundings, let us not forget that for those affected by the events of that Monday evening a light will have gone out in their lives. We pray that God will give them the strength to endure the dark days ahead.

A separate announcement in the last Parish News was made about the death of Sheila Grindrod. However, I would like to pass on the condolences of all of the Goldshaw Booth councillors to Frank Grindrod and his family. I attended her funeral on 6 May and the church was full, which was a testament to how well regarded Sheila was in the community.

The Annual Parish Meeting was held on the 9 May and a number of residents were present. gave a report on the activities and achievements of the PC over the last year and what we hope to accomplish over the next 12 months. Several residents were able to ask questions covering various subjects that were important to them. One involved the possibility of the re-establishment of the Events Committee and if one was set up by villagers, the PC would be happy to work with it. ROUGHLEE

Arrangements for the **Annual Parish Meeting** are now progressing well. We want this to be an enjoyable and interesting event and to encourage involvement you are invited to a PARISH GATHERING. The date is Monday 5th June, the time 7pm and the venue is the Village Centre.

The programme is designed to be entertaining and interesting and will end with wine and snacks giving the opportunity to look at the history exhibition and for an informal chat about village issues. The Meeting begins with a question and answer session on matters raised by villagers. This is expected to last about 20 minutes. If you have any issues you wish to raise it would help if you let us know about these before the meeting.

The Bay Horse Pub. As you will probably know many of the villagers are putting funds into an attempt to buy the pub and reopen it as an attraction for the village and for visitors. There will be an update on progress. As I write, things are looking good and there is a realistic hope of good news.

FoRA. The Friends of Roughlee's Appearance group is now up and running, led by Nigel Brotherton. Nigel will be on hand to report on progress to date.

Habitat improvements. The Parish Council is looking at the important habitats in the parish and at what we can do to protect and improve them. We are being assisted in this by The Pendle Hill Landscape Partnership and by the Wildlife Trust. Jayne Ashe of the Partnership will give a short presentation on local habitats.

History of Roughlee. The Pendle Forest History Group is arranging a display and will give a presentation on the fascinating history of our village from medieval times to the recent past. I have had the privilege to see the presentation and it is really interesting. At its peak the population of the village was over 1000 people, four times what it is now. What did these people do, where did they live and work? I hope you will enjoy learning about our past. Whilst the timings are open-ended I would

Both our Year 6 and Year 2 children completed their national end of Key Stage statutory assessments with an admirable positive and mature attitude. We are incredibly proud of all of them!

They presented a short presentation on the wonderful ideas and events our RotaKids will be organising this term. They also enjoyed a very lavish lunch and meeting children from other local RotaKids Club.
