#### **Barley Parish Council**

The poppies on Pendle Hill have no doubt caught the eye and created a talking point again, they were commissioned by Colne Town Council as part of their "Great War" remembrance event. The design agreed was to arrange a group of poppies to create the date "1918". The authorisation from the landowner and others only allowed the use of horticultural fleece which only comes in white so the colour was not significant other than red would have been less visible from a distance.

It was there for one week to mark the end of WW1 and to remind us all of those who sacrificed their lives for our freedom. A fitting tribute with these images appearing on TV and they have no doubt been seen across the globe on social media, I sent them to Italy and New Zealand. The installation must have been very difficult as the hill is particularly steep above the bracken line and there are areas of scree, rabbit holes and other constraints. It took the sculptor, Philippe Handford, two weeks to mark it out, seven hours to install and sized at 550ft by 300ft it required 3000ft of fleece to roll out.

Superfast broadband, the County Council hosted a meeting for Councils to attend which raised more queries than answers and so the County Council has gone away to gather more information and report back soon. Whilst there has been a lot of activity by BT in the area I am not aware that anyone has been connected up?

This is the centenary year of the RAF and to support their celebrations and recognise their huge contribution to the UK and beyond we have planted our beds on the car park in RAF colours, red, white and blue. We could do with a centre piece for July and August so if anybody has an idea let us know.

Other matters to report, the plans for the five new properties on the Barley Farmhouse site have been submitted and the Parish Council has objected to some of the design features. The Hospice pub walk passed off without too much distress to the village, just a handful of inconsiderate people of the about 2,500+ taking part and was a big boost for our businesses. Work continues on top of Pendle Hill to improve footpaths.

Finally, you might have noticed the "Pendle Row" sign has returned refurbished after being missing for a while, thanks to Rod Statham and John Connor for erecting it.

#### Goldshaw Booth Parish Council

My report last month started with a request to let the Parish Council know if you still wish to receive the monthly newsletter and happily, we have probably received enough replies to enable us to continue with this scheme. My thanks to those who have replied to our e mail and my Parish magazine article last month. This gives a stamp of approval to the effort we take in running the scheme and that residents are interested in receiving information about their local community, and we will continue to encourage this participation. If there is anyone else who wishes to receive the newsletter but who has not explicitly asked, then you must request the Parish council by email to clerk@goldshawbooth.org.uk.

We have painted the inside of the toilets in Newchurch at virtually no cost to the taxpayer due to a member of the PC who volunteered his services and some materials. Various jobs have been completed around the Parish as this is a busy time of the year. Again I encourage residents to identify jobs to be completed and ask any Parish Councillor to have the request considered. We will then arrange to have the work done or ask Pendle Borough Council to undertake the job. There will probably be some delay before the work is completed, but if you think your request is taking too long to be actioned, please chase and we will endeavour to speed things up.

I regret to inform residents that there has been a rare outbreak of crime in the Parish. Several thefts have been reported, which is most unusual in this area and so I must urge everyone to be vigilant for unusual activity and to report to the police any concerns they have. People may be inclined not to bother to report a minor crime, however I must encourage the reporting of any incidents.

Please remember that the Parish Council will consider all ideas about the Section 106 money for £28,000 that has been awarded. Ideas have been sent to us already and we are pleased to receive them. This is a long term project and we are hopeful to get local residents involved in deciding how we spend this money for the good of the Parish.

The football pitch in Newchurch is underused and there have been representations from some residents who would like to see it no longer used and mowing stopped. If it is to have a sustainable and viable future as a football pitch, it will need maintenance to its drainage and work on the general condition of the grass. However if it is to cease to be used for football then there has to be an alternative that is acceptable to all. This is a subject that will need to be discussed in the near future, so please let us know your views.

## Roughlee Parish Council

June was been a very busy period in the village. The Victorian Day at the Village Centre on 10th June was a well-attended and highly enjoyable day in glorious weather. On the following day, Monday 11th June, we held our formal meeting of the Parish, known as the Roughlee Parish Gathering, which involved reports by the Parish Council on past and proposed activities followed by presentations by guest speakers on topics of local interest. Some sixty villagers were present beating last year's attendance and the evening concluded with wine and nibbles. Feedback from the Gathering has been very positive but the Parish Council would welcome any thoughts and ideas on our activities and how we can be more responsive to local needs.

Another busy weekend took place on 16<sup>th</sup> / 17<sup>th</sup> June when the Pendle Pub Walk was followed by Fathers-Day at the Bay Horse. Both the pub and the Village Centre were geared up for the pub walk and hundreds, if not thousands, of walkers stopped off at the two venues which is good news for these vital local facilities.

Interest in local habitats is growing and updates are posted on the Village Website. Following the talk at the Gathering on Wild Food Foraging we are hoping to arrange a local walk to explore what we have in our Parish and to relate this to the protection of local flora and fauna.

On a related note we are hoping for support from the Borough Council capital programme to refurbish the riverside planters opposite the Bay Horse. These will be planted with wild flowers to encourage pollinators whilst significantly improving the appearance of this neglected area.

In conjunction with Barley Parish Council we are also seeking capital programme funding to repair the footpath between Thorneyholme and Whitehough. Undermining by the river has caused damage in three areas to the point where collapse of the footpath is a real risk. This is an expensive scheme and we will need funding from a number of agencies and bodies. The aim is to start work this year but a phased approach may be required.

We are again taking part in the Best Kept Village Competition and hope to improve on last year's runner-up position. Thanks to the volunteers who are again working hard to keep our village in a wonderful condition.

The hanging basket competition organised by FoRA is being help again this year. Entries are technically closed but judging will be in August so late bids may be acceptable. Contact Nigel for details.

## Roughlee CE School

What a wonderful and busy start to our final halfterm of this academic year. We have had a thorough structural survey of the school completed, which confirmed that our building is in excellent condition. We will however continue with our extensive refurbishment program during the Summer holiday; focusing on improving the school office. Members of our RotaKids attended a Rotary Conference at the University of Cumbria. This was a very enjoyable and informative day for all involved and the children's impeccable behaviour was commented on by the organisers. The PAIS Team have joined us in school and led an act of collective worship, linked to our focused Christian Value - Respect. The children have participated in the Pendle Schools' Festival and enjoyed an evening of music, dance and drama. They were captivated by the performances of the other schools involved and their own performances were also spectacular. Our Infant children entertained the audience with their angelic voices, whilst our Junior children entertained with their skilled ukulele playing and beautiful singing. It was a proud moment to watch the whole school on stage together performing in front of a live audience.

Members of the Lancashire Fire and Rescue Service have also joined us several times this month, exploring a variety of safety topics: dangers in the family home, dangers of swimming in lakes, rivers and canals and grass fires. Olivia from the Schools Sports Partnership has begun teaching our Junior children hockey skills as part of their PE curriculum. A huge thank you to the instructors from GoVelo who made this a wonderful experience for the children and thank you to Mr Fishwick, our Chair of the Resources Committee, who joined the children whilst undertaking their level 2 training on the roads around school. The children had great fun evaluating his manoeuvres.

School has welcomed the new Reception children who will be joining us in September. As part of our transition provisions these children join us every Tuesday afternoon. We currently have one space available for our new Reception class and would strongly recommend families visit us if they are interested in securing this place.

The main focus of the week is exploring the Fruit of the Spirit, which both schools have embedded within their own distinctive Christian ethos. Throughout the week the children will be enjoying a range of activities in church and learning about some of the services which take place there.
