The Vicar's Letter

The Fruit of the Spirit

In June the children of St Mary's Church of England Academy and Roughlee Church of England School joined together for three days meeting in St Mary's Church. We spent time together exploring our beautiful church and getting to know each other better.

Our themes were the Fruit of the Spirit and Celebrations.

The Fruit of the Spirit is a biblical term that sums up the nine visible attributes of a true Christian life according to Saint Paul's letter to the Galatians.

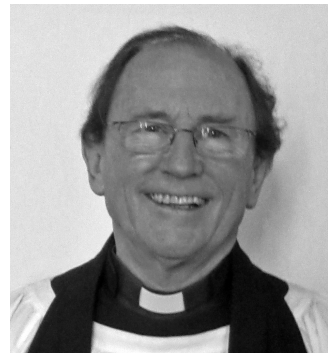
The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, gentleness and self-control (Galatians 5:22)

The passage says that all who walk in the Holy Spirit will grow this fruit.

We may dismiss one of the attributes and say that we do not have that quality but the Spirit of God possesses all nine attributes and will grow them in us if we are willing.

Sometimes we meet someone who clearly shows these attributes and one such person was the Revd John Hallows the previous Vicar of St Mary's Newchurch and St Thomas' Barrowford and lately St Mary's Gisburn.

John died suddenly on 28th June and he will be deeply missed by the many people he served as a dedicated Parish priest. Our prayers remain with his family as they mourn his loss.



John was at Whalley Abbey when he died whilst acting as Chaplain to the new generation of priests at their ordination retreat.

Bishop Phillip and Bishop Julian said, "John was outstanding in his commitment and love for his people and his desire to make new disciples for Jesus Christ."

John placed all his trust in Jesus, and so today as we grieve, we do so confident that God has completed that remarkable work in him and that through the Resurrection, John feasts now at the banquet of the Kingdom'

This was a joint project between the Parish Council and St Mary's School. Pupils have designed individual flags and learnt about the proud history of the RAF. The Parish Council wishes to thank Mrs Pauline Nightingale, the Headteacher of St Mary's Primary Academy, and the pupils and staff for making this project possible.

The Parish Council would like to thank Chris Hudson for his past service as Parish Councillor over many years but he feels he wishes to stand down due to work and family commitments. His resignation now leaves a vacancy, so if anyone feels they would like to make a positive contribution to their community by becoming a Parish Councillor, please come forward.

In last month's Parish Newsletter I raised the question about the future of the playing field. This has elicited a number of responses from the public. We are not in a position yet to make a final decision about its future, but I can promise that all responses will be listened to and all options explored. If any resident has any ideas they wish to make then please contact any councillor or the Parish Clerk.

I can confirm that the monthly newsletter that we send out by e mail will restart this month as there is sufficient demand. I am personally glad about this because as far as I know, we are the only parish council that operates such a scheme and it shows that the extra effort that goes into producing the newsletter is appreciated.

Residents will have seen that, at last, the speed indicator device [SPID] is now in operation in Spenbrook Road . This has been a joint project with other parishes and led by County Councillor Christian Wakeford and our thanks go to him for making the whole thing happen in the first place and to Carl Ryder for supplying and putting the SPID pole up.

During the present hot spell and drought, volunteers have been busy keeping the gardens in Newchurch presentable and watered and I would like to thank them on behalf of all residents for their hard work.

Finally, I would like to ask for volunteers to take part in a heritage project for the parish. Our long serving councillor Mrs Wilkinson informed other councillors about a scheme first introduced back in the late 1990s which involved photographs being taken of properties and sites around our parish. It is hoped that

photographs could be taken again to show how the area has changed and serve as a pictorial record for the community. If you feel you wish to take part in this very interesting project please let any councillor know or come to the next parish council meeting on August 14th at St Mary's school. Christopher Burt

Roughlee Parish Council

The long dry spell was broken on the 16th July by a torrential rain storm. The water was much needed for the fields and gardens but continued sunshine for the school holidays will no doubt be welcomed. One effect of the hot dry spell is the abundance of butterflies in the area. Some residents have posted beautiful photographs on Facebook so take a look. The weather has also been kind for birds with starlings and jays doing particularly well. Don't forget we are compiling information on local flora and fauna so if you have any interesting photographs please post them on the village website.

Support from the Borough Council for our capital programme schemes met with mixed success because the resources available are limited. Bids to the Barrowford and Western Parishes Committee from local Town and Parish Councils amounted to £32,700 whilst the available allocation is just £20,600. Roughlee was awarded £2500 towards the Thorneyholme to Whitehough footpath repairs. This sum, together with a similar amount for Barley and two separate contributions of £5000 from the Footpath Officer and £5000 from Barley Parish Council means that we have £15,000 available towards a scheme expected to cost in the region of £30,000. Bids for the balance are in hand and there is a real prospect that works will start in the Spring.

Our other bid was for the wildflower planters on the river retaining wall opposite the Bay Horse. Whilst no immediate support is available the Parish Council are looking at other means to make a start this year. Progress has been made, however, on the provision of a picnic bench on the riverside by the school car park. This should be in place by the time this article is published.

On the 1st July the Village Centre hosted the Mayor and Mayoress's garden party. This was a well-attended and enjoyable day which raised significant sums for various charities. As well as many local people the event was attended by the Mayors from surrounding Districts. It was a privilege to showcase our village in this way.

As a correction to the date I mentioned in last month's News the Duck Race and Family BBQ will now take place on Sunday 12th August. 2pm for the Duck Race at the school car park and 3pm at the Village Centre for the BBQ. I am away on that day which means that the first prize for the Duck Race is up for grabs! I hope you will support both events which are a lot of fun.
