The Vicar's Letter


To everything there is a season (Ecclesiastes 3:1 NRSV)

September sees the start of a new school year and we pray that all those involved in our schools will have a fruitful and enjoyable time during the 2018/19 academic year. We pray for those beginning school and those moving to a new school. We pray too for those beginning or returning to college or university.

September sees the Church celebrate the Season of Creation and the beginning of the Season of Invitation.

At St Mary's we will be celebrating the Season of Creation during the first four weeks of September. Each week we will look at a different aspect of creation. This year the weekly themes we shall be exploring are earth, humanity, sky and mountain.

This gives us the opportunity to reflect on the beauty of creation and how we take care of it. During our Patronal Festival Weekend the theme of the Flower Festival is All Creatures Great and Small. A chance to give thanks for all the wonderful creatures we share this world with and reflect on our ability to care for them.(Genesis 1:26 NRSV).



There are many stories of animals in the Bible. I wonder which one is your favourite? I've always been fond of the one with the talking donkey in Numbers 22:21-39.

Our Harvest service on October the 7th will see us supporting local causes such as the Women's Refuge and Foodbank with donations. We will also be asking for monetary donations for the Bishop of Blackburn's Harvest Appeal supporting orphaned children in Sierra Leone and the Quilombola communities in Brazil.

The Season of Invitation grew out of the Back to Church Sunday initiative. We are now encouraged to invite people to a series of events rather than just one service in September. These include a service in September, Harvest in October, Remembrance and All Souls in November and a service at the beginning of December and Christmas Services.

We can of course invite people to come to Church at any time but why not take the plunge and invite someone you know to join us in the next few months? Or if it's been a while since you came to church why not join us yourself? You will be most welcome.

Barley Parish Council

I hope many of you were able to get out and watch the 10th annual tractor rally last weekend, there was a good attendance in Barley and I understand they collected over £7,500 for a cancer charity on route – splendid show and a great collection for charity.

I am sure that those on spring water in the village will have been relieved to see the return of more normal summer weather in these climates with the regular dash of water sprinkled around the place. Spring Water stocks and the reservoirs are refilling and the grass is back to green but it was good whilst those hot summer days lasted.

At the last Parish Council meeting it was agreed to progress a design which includes boulders and shrubs to enhance the entrance to Narrowgates and hopefully prevent car parking which damages the verges.

Another project considered was traffic calming measures on Barley Green. The residents want to reduce speeds to 20mph and discussions included a range of measures you will all be familiar with. A number of residents attended the meeting and the final agreement was to progress signage which we hope will be effective without having to introduce

more physical measure to slow down inconsiderate drivers. United Utilities will be involved.

Planning issues — as reported previously the Barley Farmhouse Development of five homes, which has outline planning approved, has progressed to the design stage. The developer has had positive discussions with the parish council to receive our views on design and materials to be used which clarified some matters which the Council had concern about and provided an opportunity to exchange ideas. I understand the developer is considering amendments to the plans and a new planning application will follow in due course to the BWP committee.

It is with much disappointment that I have to report another theft from the toilet donation box. This time the thief came armed with equipment capable of breaking the locks, this is not a chance thief but a desperate malicious criminal determined to steal a few pounds from us. From now on the money will be removed daily (as we do the car park donation box) to minimise any future losses. Please be vigilant if you see anyone suspiciously hanging around the car park and toilet block to get a description of the person and a vehicle registration number.

Goldshaw Booth Parish Council

Residents will be aware that there was a house fire in Gorrell Close in Spenbrook earlier in August, but thankfully there were no injuries, as far as I am aware. Our sympathies however, go to Mr and Mrs Mann and their family who have got to deal with the inconvenience and upset of the fire and its aftermath.

Last month I asked for a volunteer or volunteers to take part in a heritage project to photograph various houses and properties in the parish. The project was started in 1998 and gives a pictorial history of our area. Happily we have had our first volunteer who will keep the project going, and although this is very encouraging, I am sure that if anyone else wishes to come forward, they will find the effort required worthwhile.

Entry to the top playing field in Newchurch must always be kept clear so that contractors who mow the two fields and the pathways in Sparable Wood can get access for their machinery. There have been cases of inconsiderate parking by the entry gate at the side of Frances House which have prevented this. Can I please insist that this entry point is kept clear at all times.

The subject of the future of the playing field was discussed again at the last Parish Council meeting in August. In the interests of local democracy, we had put this subject out to consultation to the public and I would like to thank all those people who contacted the Parish Council with their views. The matter will be decided when the 2019/2020 budget for the Parish Council is agreed in January 2019.

I mentioned last month that there is now a vacancy for a Parish Councillor. If you are interested in representing the residents in your parish, please come to the next council meeting to see how we run things. You can then make a judgement about your future participation in your local community. It is not for everyone, but if you are prepared to invest in your community, the role of parish councillor can be a rewarding one.

Roughlee Parish Council

August saw a couple of interesting events in the Parish. On the 3rd some 15 villagers joined Bushcraft expert, Adrian Rose, for an evening ramble through Bank End wood and Lower Blacko valley on a foraging expedition. The aim was to explore edible, medicinal and dangerous plants and fungi in our countryside. A definite historic link to those wise women known as the Pendle Witches. It was an entertaining and instructive couple of hours which keys into the ongoing work to discover more about habitats in Roughlee. Many of the participants got real value for their efforts as we discovered a field full of fresh mushrooms which were quickly gathered for the table.

As previously reported the Parish Council is working with Lancashire Wildlife Trust to improve our knowledge of habitats in the village. Whilst we have a preliminary list of flora and fora it is far from complete and a number of new additions were spotted on the foraging walk. We have begun to place items of interest on the village website, including pictures of birds and butterflies. Most of the work so far has been undertaken by Mary and Simon but it is a time consuming and lengthy task. As such we are seeking volunteers who are interested in our habitats to help with uploading pictures and information onto the website. Training can be provided so no great expertise is necessary. Please let us know if you are interested.

The 12th the August saw the return of the traditional Duck Race and Family BBQ. Ticket sales

for both were excellent and the deserving winner of the Duck Race was Doruk, grandson of Christine and Terry Wilkinson. Much excitement all round! The BBQ went well with the livelier elements of the village dancing late into the night.

The new picnic bench on the riverside below the school car park is proving to be a well-used success. Thanks to the Hartley family who own the land and have agreed to the use.

The FoRA group, ably chaired by Nigel Brotherton, has been very active with balsam bashing and preparing the village for the Best Kept Village Competition. We are through to round two of the competition, but so are our neighbouring villages so the competition will be tough! Many people have contributed to a number of sites and flower boxes. It is probably unfair to single out specific sites but the area around the Happy Valley bus shelter deserves special mention. Also, one notable improvement to the village this year has been the improvement of the former telephone box site next to Crowtrees. This work was undertaken by Frank Timberlake and looks really great.

The hanging basket competition was again well supported. This year's winner is Bob Yates with Ian Mortimer and Gail Carson also in the prizes.

Finally, due to holiday arrangements, it has been necessary to change the date of the next Parish Council meeting which will now be held on Monday 10th September at 7pm.
