

The Vicar's Letter

Barley has made it to the finals of the Best Kept Village competition and judging is underway as I am writing this article. The village has looked good all summer and the Council would like to thank Frank Grindrod who has done a sterling job of preparing and maintaining our flower beds and removing weeds around the village. Residents have done their bit of course and hopefully we will have more success.

Last month I wrote about CCTV being installed in the village and since then it has been reported that we had two burglars chancing their luck by trying house and car doors etc in the middle of the night with entry limited to cars only. Whilst some damage was done, I am not aware of any significant thefts but CCTV owned by residents proved to be useful and it is reported two people have been arrested. No doubt the distress to those involved was most unwanted.

The PC considered introducing CCTV at both ends of the village but realised there is much more to introducing CCTV into public areas than you might think in terms of purpose, privacy, consultation, individual councillor responsibilities, access to and storage of images etc along with significant penalties for breach of legislation. It would seem that private CCTV systems are at least as valuable as public systems. Councillors promoting this project are reviewing what we need to do to comply with legislation and guidance.

The Council are again looking to recruit a new Clerk who can take on the responsibility for administering our business and guiding the council. If you are interested please look out for an advert on the notice-board and on the Barley Past & Present Facebook page.

The Council has appointed a contractor to construct a tarmac road through the first sections of the car park. The road will reduce the future costs of pot hole repair and should encourage better use of the parking area. Works are anticipated to take one week and commence late September or early October.

Works are being undertaken to improve an old footpath to the rear of the car park and this is being funded by the Pendle Hill Landscape Project. Once the footpath is completed volunteers will work on removing scrub and the invasive balsam so encouraging the development of a better habitat for wild flowers and wild life as well as

opening a short walk for residents and visitors.

Finally, following my invitation to residents to take on responsibility for maintaining the village by adopting a bench, a road sign, maybe a flower bed and keeping it tidy.

The Council are grateful to have Janet & Bob Pemberton volunteering to look after two car park benches, Derek Oldham maintaining the Celtic bench beyond Narrowgates and Roger Clarkson the Cross Lane street sign. Any more volunteers out there? Derek Heap

Goldshaw Booth Parish Council

The Spen Brook mill development is now underway but not without a few issues which have been reported by local residents. If I could ask that anyone who has any further issues to contact me directly or the parish clerk as I am in contact with the site owner. He has assured me that if I contact him, he will resolve the issues directly.

As part of the development, the parish has received a sum of money from the 'section 106 agreement', donated by the developer to be used to enhance the open spaces of the parish. This sum is in the region of £28,000. The council will shortly be delivering questionnaires to all properties within the parish to allow you to have your say on how this money should be used. Some ideasalready been suggested and these will been shown on the questionnaire for you to choose from or for you to add your own ideas or comments.

The judging for the Best Kept Village competition is ongoing. We have not had any update at present but the final judging period is the 29th and 30th August. Thank you to all residents who are continuing to make the effort in keeping the villages looking good.

Finally, there is currently a vacancy on the parish council due to a recent resignation. If anyone within the parish is interested in becoming a councillor, please either contact myself, the parish clerk or by attending the monthly council meeting.

New Digital Grave Record for St. Mary's Church

It all began in May 2017 when Pendle And Burnley Branch of the LFHHS made an interesting out-visit to St. Mary's and were given an excellent talk about the church by John Parsons. He also showed us the Burial Register from 1857 onwards.

Many of my relatives are buried amongst the 2650+ in the churchyard so I asked if the register was available on the net; answer: "No"; but the Church Council were hoping it might be eventually digitised. Ideal combination as John gets queries from people wanting to know about their families.

Result was a datasheet listing all the burials. John took brilliant pictures of all the pages in the Register and I added them as individual entries to the datasheet after listing the burials in alphabetical order on a separate working sheet.

As I happened to have a list as transcribed in 1982, it seemed a shame not to link them in as well and from there to add births, deaths and marriages and other information where possible. After that, it seemed a good idea to link in pictures of gravestones where visible and this is currently being done. It is hoped to link in the Baptismal registers as transcribed by Dr Brenda Hustler later this year.

Roughlee Parish Council

Much of the Parish Council focus over the past month has seen a continuation of routine items with an emphasis on keeping the village tidy. We are also progressing the work on habitats and the proposed village greenhouse. Perhaps more importantly our last meeting was dominated by a number of major planning issues.

In explaining these issues it is worth reminding villagers on the role of the Parish Council in dealing with planning matters. The Parish Council is consulted on all planning applications submitted within our area. We also deal with complaints on unauthorised development. In both cases we listen to representations from local people and send our comments and recommendations to the Borough Council who are the Local Planning Authority and make decisions on planning applications and enforcement matters. In most cases these decisions are taken by the Barrowford and Western Parishes Area Committee but some are referred to the Policy and Resources Committee. Any application refused can be the subject of an appeal to the Planning Inspectorate, an agency of central government.

In dealing with planning matters the Parish Council's approach is very much determined by what we see as duty to protect the amenity of our beautiful countryside and the character of buildings. The Parish is wholly within an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. This is a nationally designated area and is afforded a very high level of protection from development which threatens the character of the area. This protection is also reflected in the Pendle Local Plan.

Of the three planning issues on our last agenda one related to a large picture window on Dabs House, the new house at the junction of Ridge Lane and Blacko Bar Road. The design of the house was approved on appeal and included traditional mullion widows. The large picture window is unauthorised and out of character with the approved scheme and has been the subject of complaint locally. After representations from the Parish Council the

Borough Council have resolved to take enforcement action.

Two separate applications have also been made to build two large houses on open land outside of the village boundary. One involves development in the open land across the river to the south of Blacko Bar Road. The other is in the field off Barley New Road between Thorneyholme Hall and the Jinney Lane junction. This second application is an amended scheme. A similar application was refused in January 2019 and is now subject to appeal.

Both applications are made by local people and, in one case a local need justification was put forward. Having listened to the applicants the Parish Council decided to recommend the refusal of both applications. If allowed the schemes would result in highly visible and intrusive development in the AONB. Approval could also result in the development of similar sites throughout Pendleside. It remains to be seen what decisions the Borough Council will make but the Parish Council is determined to do all we can to protect our beautiful area from unjustified and speculative development.
