

# The Vicar's Letter

**Happy Hour** 

In spring we put the clocks forward and we lose an hour which for those of us who like our sleep is not much fun and we may be just a little grumpy!

Fast forward to the autumn when we put the clocks back and we're much happier because we gain an extra hour but this year I've decided to do something different with that extra hour and not simply sleep it away. (I'll try not to be grumpy!!)

These are some of the possibilities for Sunday 28th October.

Bake a cake- Something unusual like courgette and orange

Send some thank yous- St Paul loved writing letters but we have more options. Show someone you appreciate them and all they do for you.

Music- Many pieces of music last for an hour or so. Whatever your taste there will be one to suit. Queens Greatest Hits lasts just under an hour or why not try Beethoven's Symphony Number 9?

Read-Shakespeare's work is usually spoken at the rate of roughly 1,000 lines per hour. The Bard's shortest farce, The Comedy of Errors, comes in at just 1,786 lines – so you should be able to reach the end within the hour if you don't dawdle.

This year we put the clocks back on Bible Sunday so why not try using the extra hour to read the Bible. The Bible has 66 books but many of them can be read in an hour. You could try one book like Nehemiah or Romans or combine a few like Galatians, Ruth and Micah.

I Thessalonians can be read in approximately 20 minutes and in chapter 5 verse 17 it says 'Pray without ceasing'. The Greek word for 'without ceasing' that is used is adialeiptos which doesn't mean non-stop but actually means constantly recurring.

We pray constantly at St Mary's for many things. Everyone is welcome to join us at our services which always include prayers. If you have something you would like us to pray for please let us know.

## **Barley Parish Council**

In recent years I would be starting this the October edition by announcing how well we had done in the Best Kept Village Competition but this year I can only report that we have not been invited to the awards ceremony. Good luck to our neighbours who have been invited and I wish them well, I have seen their volunteers out there tidying and improving their patch and all of us in the pendleside village's benefit from those who make the effort to make our area look clean, tidy and well maintained.

The Pendle Hill Landscape Partnership (PHLP) now has a four-year scheme aiming to re-establish links between Pendle Hill and its surrounding communities and the first projects have started. The PHLP is funded by Heritage Lottery and one of its key early aims is to make the hill, which dominates our local landscape, more accessible.

More than three decades ago extensive work was done on the steps which take walkers up the "big end". Around 20 years ago flagstones from derelict mills were air-lifted in to make a firmer path from Boar Clough to the summit.

For several weeks excavators have been visible at the top of the hill as older eroded paths are improved with the aim of keeping walkers concentrated on defined routes to help prevent further erosion. The new paths will clearly define routes away from the summit to the various paths off the top and make the top of the hill much more accessible whatever the weather. This might not receive everyone's approval but no doubt there was the same misgivings when the paths were previously improved.

The PHLP invite us all on Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> October to celebrate their launch with a walk up to the top of the hill starting from Barley Car Park at 10.30am onwards, last departure at 11am. This is an opportunity to learn more about what they are doing.

Planning issues — the Barley Farmhouse Development is again back in the planning arena and an application to build an extension on to the north end of the Bullion (No.7) has just completed the consultation period.

Finally, it is with regret that I inform you that Susan Statham has resigned from the PC. Susan brought so much to the Council and energised many aspects of the routine work we do. She will probably be best remembered for her work improving the playground. We are now seeking a new Councillor to fill the vacancy. If you are interested give Vicky or myself a call for a chat about what is involved.

#### Goldshaw Booth Parish Council

Many residents have asked me when is the development at Spenbrook Mill is to start but I am afraid my answer is the same to everyone, which is that I do not know. There have been all kinds of stories circulating about when work is to start and we will only really know when the workmen actually arrive. I am sure Ingham and Keers, the owners, are as keen for work to start as we are. The Parish Council is aware that the safety of the public is of paramount importance and we remain concerned about the fencing around the perimeter of the site as winter approaches and the danger to motorists increases. We will remain vigilant about the condition of the fencing and keep in contact with the owners if we become concerned.

The Parish Council at it's meeting on 11 September has finally given the go ahead to a local contractor to start work on the blocked drain in the field by Sparable Wood. Although I am not in a position to say when the job will start, we are confident that it will be soon. It has taken a long time to even to get to the stage of awarding a contract, as we have had to apply for a grant from Barrowford and Western Parishes committee in order to fund this repair. The contract process takes a large amount of time to complete because we have to be seen to be acting fairly on behalf of the residents and taxpayers of the parish. All this takes time and we hope residents will understand our desire to get the job done and balance that with obtaining good value for everyone.

We will be making spring bulbs available again for the benefit of the parish. This happened a couple of years ago and was very popular and we hope to repeat it again.

There was an extra meeting this month when the Parish Council met about a planning application at Douglas Hall Kennels. Several members of the public attended and the application was discussed at length and we then made our comments to Pendle Borough Council. This was an example of local democracy at work and I think we have reflected the views of the public that attended as well as the council itself.

I wrote last month that we have a vacancy for a parish councillor and there have been expressions of interest, however if anyone wishes to represent their own community, then you have to come to a couple of meetings in order to see what happens and if you feel you may fit in.

# Roughlee Parish Council

The really good news to emerge in September was that Roughlee is through to the last two of the Best Kept Village competition, the other village being Wiswell. Last year we were runners-up in this competition so we definitely cannot do worse than last year! Naturally we hope to do better and to take the winning spot. The results are due to be announced at a presentation on 15th October. Many villagers have been involved in the hard work which is needed to keep our village in great condition so thank you to you all. Special thanks though to Parish Councillor Nigel Brotherton for organising and prompting our efforts.

The story of the repairs to the footpath between Thorneyholme and Whitehough is a case of one step forward and two back at the moment. This is a joint venture with Barley Council and just when we thought we were making progress a more accurate estimate arrived at over £60,000, over twice the original figure. Inevitably this will delay things whilst we explore cheaper options.

More positively we have now given the go-ahead for the restoration and planting of the wild flower planters on the river bank opposite the Bay Horse. Hopefully we will see the benefits next Spring / Summer.

In the near future we will be installing three small discreet signs drawing attention to the fisheries public car park. This is a village car park but is largely underused. We hope the signage will help visitors to find somewhere to park.

The 100 club draw on behalf of St Mary's School took place for July, the winners were:

In the past few weeks a number, but not all, of the potholes in the village have been treated by the County Council. It is a pity that some have been left dished which probably means they will not last the winter. We will continue to press for the remaining potholes to be treated properly.

Some progress has been made to deliver Superfast Broadband to the village, for example a ring-main has been installed in Crowtrees Grove which allows those residents who want the service to connect relatively easily. However, the coverage is patchy so Simon Cronshaw is arranging for a follow-up survey to understand who currently has access, who still needs it and whether or not they are able to access it. If the demand is there for better access we will look at the possibility of a community scheme to help fund it. Pleasingly the Village Centre is being well used with increasing interest from outside organisations. For example the Colne Noyna Inner Wheel will be holding a Beetle Drive at 7pm on the 20th October. Contact 07725 614235 for details. Future events organised by the Village Centre Committee are detailed elsewhere in this News with the main event being the Halloween Festival on 27-28 October. This should be a great event so make a note in your diaries

Finally, congratulations to villagers James and Janet Starkie. Their mayoral year is clearly hard work but they look to be thriving and doing a great job.
