Vicar's Letter

Food Glorious Food

As I write this the new series of The Great British Bake Off has just begun and I'm looking forward to watching all ten episodes hopefully without a soggy bottom in sight!

This got me thinking about food and meals which feature heavily in the bible from the apple in Genesis through to the heavenly banquet mentioned in Revelation.

Apparently, most of us eat three meals a day which adds up to 1095 meals in a year. That's 1095 opportunities to say grace and give thanks to God for the food we eat, the people we share it with and those who produce it.

The bible talks about many occasions when Jesus shared a meal the most famous one being the Last Supper which we remember when we share Holy Communion in church usually on Sundays but of course this can be celebrated on any day of the week.

Eating together is a wonderful way of connecting with other people. It doesn't matter if it's a cuppa and a slice of cake or a full blown six course fancy dinner it still gives us the opportunity to share and love people as Jesus teaches us to do. As well as looking forward to the Bake Off episodes I'm also going to enjoy being able to have a cuppa after the Sunday morning services again. This will resume after the Harvest Service at 9.30am on Sunday 3rd October I do hope you can join us.

Each series of the Bake Off uses over 1000 eggs. The church has used red eggs as a symbol of Easter for centuries. The red colour represents Christ's blood and the egg itself reminds us of the resurrection and the new life that Christ gives us through the cross.

Below is an activity from Multi- Sensory Church by Sue Wallace which although designed to be used in churches could easily be done at home and not just at Easter as we can need new life and hope throughout the year.

You will need one red hardboiled egg for each person. Each person then writes the name of someone they feel needs new life or renewed hope on the egg with a felt tip pen. Then pass the eggs around so that people can read each other's names and pray for those people. Then smash the eggs symbolically and use this prayer before eating the eggs.

Lord Jesus, as you smashed your way out of the cold tomb, we pray that as we smash these eggs, you would bring all these people we have prayed for new life, new hope and the joy of knowing you. Amen

If you are able to come to the Harvest Service on the 3rd October donations of dried food, tins and toiletries will be welcome to share between local charities.

And to finish with some graces you can use before meals.

For this splendid meal, we thank the Lord.
The food looks delicious and the drink refreshing.
So let us taste and see that the Lord is good. (based on Psalm 34:8)

Jesus, Bread of Life, feed us that we may truly live. (John 6:51)

And if you're in a hurry the shortest grace I know is Ta Pa (a reference to God our Father).

Times continue to be strange, Covid cases are still fairly high and for the first time the Ribble Valley has more cases per 100k than both Burnley & Pendle. The Pendle Pub walk marched on over the weekend as the government said many of us need booster jabs, and many are taking the opportunity to holiday abroad for the first time in 18 months. The high cost of gas energy is dominating the news and carbon dioxide, seemingly the cause of global warming, is in such short supply it could affect the food supply chain. There is a lot still going on.

As I have reported previously, Barley has progressed to the final of the Best Kept Village competition and judging has been completed. The competition holds a red-carpet event at Eaves Hall in early October and we will be winner or runner-up, whatever the outcome we have done really well to get to the final.

The Council has joined forces with Pendle BC to apply for a grant to improve drainage on the village green. They are preparing a drainage design for us and our amended bid for a grant will be submitted to the Lancashire Environmental Fund in December. If successful we should be able to start works in early spring. In the meantime, we have made arrangements for verti-draining work (aerating) of the green with PBC, the work was carried out this last week and should offer some short-term improvements. Other works are planned by the Council in October to repair the damaged matting under the swings on the playground.

As you probably know, Barley is joining with Newchurch and Roughlee to organise a Queen's Platinum Jubilee event in June 2022. Barley will have three representatives on the organising committee, they are Joanne Hunt, Karen Lund and Rita Seymour and I am sure you will hear from them over the coming months.

A couple of updates, the Council are still progressing a contract with our partner to restrict parking on the turning circle but it is taking longer than we hoped. At Whitehough, the owner of the bridge has now erected signage on the bridge restricting the weight limit to 3 tonnes which should offer some protection to the structure.

Finally, Richard Fowler has decided to stand down from the Council from next month. Richard has made a good contribution during his time on the Council and was the driving force behind introducing CCTV in to the village. With Sheena and Richard leaving there are now two vacancies on the Council and we will be following the statutory processes for advertising these positions on public noticeboards and then on Residents Facebook in the next couple of weeks. It is now time for others to step up and do their bit so if you are interested, please drop me a line or give me a call. We are also still looking to fill our vacant Clerk position Derek Heap
