# The Vicar's Letter

#### Remembrance

In 2014 when we recalled the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the beginning of the First World War, the Bible Society produced a beautiful booklet of psalms, poetry, prayers, personal stories and paintings called, 'Hear My Cry'.

In his foreword, General the Lord Dannatt wrote, 'To make sense of war we can do nothing better than place our hope and faith in God and in his Son, Jesus Christ. This publication is a timely guide to help us to do just that.'



This year churches of all denominations have continued to echo his words as they have joined in daily prayer since the 4<sup>th</sup> August and will continue to do so until the 11<sup>th</sup> November as the nation did in 1914 (see remembrance100co.uk).

At our Remembrance Sunday service we shall be giving away a small booklet called 'Silence....we will remember them' published by remembrance 100 and HOPE.

The booklet is designed so that each of us can reflect on the 11th day of the 11th month and beyond.

Art can be an important part of our spiritual life and so often people use art to express difficult and painful emotions.

Below is an extract from the reflection of Sister Wendy Beckett on The Cornfield painted in 1918 by John Nash.

"In 1918 John Nash drew a great line under 'the pure murder' of the last four years by painting *The Cornfield*. I think it expresses what Nash felt should succeed the war. It is an image of absolute peace. Everywhere there is space and sunlight. There is no fear, only hope and tranquillity. We know, very sadly that this spiritual state was not, in fact, the result of the war. Perhaps John Nash knew it too because harmony, confidence and freedom come from a change of heart, and the human heart is slow to change. But he hoped." (Hear My Cry p69)

We continue to hope in the aftermath of the Second World War and other conflicts.....

Heavenly Father, whose heart is selfless love, take pity on our divided world; and grant that we may follow in the steps of your Son in giving ourselves to the service of others and reaching out to the marginalised and the despised, that peace and justice may triumph and your kingdom come on earth. In Christ's name we pray. Amen.

The silence booklet concludes with these words from the Bible,' And now these three remain: Faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.' 1 Corinthians 13:13

In this time of remembering may God's love fill you with hope for the future.

## **Barley Parish Council**

The annual Remembrance Service gathering will start at 1030hrs inside the Village Hall on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> November leading on to a short ceremony and two minutes silence at the Turning Circle Memorial Stone at 1100Hrs. This year the congregation from the Methodist Chapel will join us and the Minister will give a reading. Cllr Connor is again organising and the deputy mayor will be contributing to the service – please come along and wear your poppy in memory of local people who gave everything.

The WI are commemorating this year's remembrance service with a display in the gardens on the car park using recycled plastic and I recommend you take a look.

Planning issues – as reported previously the Barley Farmhouse Development of five homes, which has outline planning approved, has progressed to the design stage. The developer has had positive discussions with the parish council to receive our views on design and materials to be used which clarified some matters which the Council had concern about and provided an opportunity to exchange ideas. On the 27 September the Parish Council held an extraordinary meeting specifically to consider this important development. The Council were pleased to see changes and clarifications to the original design which the Council believe enhanced the previous design and satisfied a number of our earlier concerns. The Council has raised no further planning objections. Being such a significant development, this has been a challenging process to consider various design styles and views on what is traditional or not in our village given we have a significant variation of styles through the village. The development will be mainly unseen from the public highway but the first property will be visible and will reflect Barley Farm House and the other four will reflect the style of the Pendle Inn.

Finally, congratulations to Roughlee on winning the Best Kept Village competition. Their team of residents who cleaned and tidied their village was probably the difference and has given them a well-deserved win.

#### Goldshaw Booth Parish Council

I am sorry to inform residents that the collection box at Newchurch toilets has been broken into twice within the last month. The box is emptied daily, so there is never a great deal of cash available, but it causes inconvenience to councillors who have to repair or replace anything that is damaged and there is cost to the Parish Council who has to pay for the materials. The Parish Council is taking further measures to improve security, which we hope will stop theft in the future.

The money that we collect from the donation box is used to keep the toilets open to the public and we just cannot afford the disruption that these thefts cause. I expect that residents know that we receive no financial help from Pendle Borough Council or Lancashire County Council and that we pay for and maintain these facilities from our own resources.

We have had the annual report from Pendle Borough Council concerning the play area and equipment. They did not identify anything of serious risk to the public, however one piece of equipment will be taken out of action as part of the wooden structure was rotten. There are regular checks to the play area in addition to the yearly report, so we are constantly reviewing safety. I think that at some stage in the not too distant future, we will have a review of all of the playground equipment to see if improvements can be made and to consider possible replacements. It does seem to me that the play area is lightly used and I think that is a pity as the actual site is in a glorious position. It may be that the equipment that we have at present is a little tired looking and does not cater for all age groups. You can be sure that this subject will be fully discussed by councillors, who will come to a considered opinion.

Residents may remember that the Parish Council purchased spring bulbs a couple of years ago which were planted in public areas around the parish by the public themselves. We have decided to repeat the exercise and we have started by inviting the pupils of St Mary's school to plant bulbs in the bank outside the school. More bulbs will be available shortly for the public. I would like to thank the volunteers for attending to the flower beds and baskets in Newchurch, which are looking very smart.

## Roughlee Parish Council

Well, we actually made it! The reward for all of the hard work over the summer has been to win the Hamlet class in the Lancashire Best Kept Village competition. Congratulations to all of the many villagers who helped to improve on last year's second place. Particular thanks to Nigel Brotherton and the FoRA group for providing the organisation and leadership. The prize was collected by Nigel and Bob Yates at a ceremony on 15th October. There is a good picture on the Roughlee Then and Now Facebook page showing the winners with the Mayor and Mayoress. Have a look.

Back to more mundane things the Parish Council continues to work away at a number of intractable problems. The list is not exhaustive but includes the footpath at Thorneyholme, (cheaper options are being explored), the water flowing down the lower end of Pasture Lane (the problem seems to stem from defective field drains but the County Council have a responsibility to keep the highway safe), and Superfast Broadband. Simon is still looking at the results of the survey announced in last month's News but if you have not taken part please visit <a href="https://www.roughlee.org.uk/superfast">www.roughlee.org.uk/superfast</a> to let us know the present situation.

Work continues on the Habitat page of the village website and thanks go to Gill Fawcett for the time she is devoting to this. You will hopefully see the result by Spring next year. Related to this we are looking at a possible grant application to the Pendle

Hill Landscape Partnership community grant scheme. This may help us to do more wild flower planting, to display interpretation panels explaining the importance of flowers and pollinators and to relate this to ongoing work by FoRA and Roughlee School.

A late item on our last Parish Council meeting was to consider the Lomeshaye Development Brief. This deals with the expansion of the existing industrial estate onto land alongside the A6068 Barrowford Road. Although details are sketchy this will probably involve a new industrial access onto Barrowford Road and there is real concern about traffic issues both on the road and on Junction 13 of the M65. Although put out for consultation in September the consultation exercise was of a limited nature and did not include local Parish Councils or the Barrowford and Western Parishes Area Committee. We hope to see the consultation relaunched so you may wish to look out for this.

It's getting to that time of year again and Christmas events are fast approaching. The Roughlee Village Centre Committee has been busy so look out for local publicity. The next major event is the return of season of plays and events starting with Osun's Story on the 15th November.

Finally we have, again, been forced to change the date of our next Parish Council meeting which will be on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> November. This is because a number of Councillors are on holiday. My apologies for any inconvenience. Andrew Walker
