Barley Parish Council

Barley held its Remembrance Service on Saturday 11 November and at the appointed time a sermon was read by our new vicar, Julie Smith, and after the last post wreaths were laid by our local MP, the Mayor of Pendle BC, our County Councillor and John Connor representing the Parish Council. About fifty residents attended and the event was a fine tribute to all those who gave everything. It was a fitting moment for reflection.

Barley is the winner of the Lancashire Best Kept Village (Hamlet Class) for 2017 pipping our neighbours in Newchurch and Roughlee and beating all thirteen entrants in the competition. The village has looked clean, tidy and looked after all summer and this was clearly appreciated by the judges and I am glad that the efforts of many villagers have been recognised.

The competition is designed to encourage community effort and involvement in keeping villages and their facilities tidy and well maintained and I believe the competition does provide a focus, but in the end, we all benefit from looking after our own patch. The Pendle Inn won the BKV 'Village Pub of the Year award' and there was also a "Highly Commended" award for our War Memorial from the judges.

On behalf of the Parish Council I would like to thank the villagers and businesses who contributed in some way and on a personal note to thank John Connor who was the lead Councillor on this project and Frank Wilkinson who kept on top of our landscape areas as our lengthsman.

Vehicles parking in the turning circle has again become a problem and so the Council has made representations to local businesses and residents to support us in retaining the turning circle as it's intended purpose. Letters have been sent out confirming this land is now in the ownership, by deed, of the Parish Council which gives us powers to decide what we do with it and that at the last two Annual Parish meetings (APM), attended by over 40No villagers, the PC has received unanimous support to retain the turning circle for the purpose it was intended and to retain an attractive village centre including our war memorial. The PC remains committed to retaining this land for the above purposes and not to it becoming a car park - we already have a huge car park.

I am pleased to report that the Parish Council and Lancashire County Council have worked together to improve the parking lay-by on Barley Lane by spreading road planings in the area to raise the lay-by back to road level.

Finally, the last time I wrote I reported a thief amongst us who had stolen money from the toilet donation boxes. The same person has tried to steal the car park takings and so we would be pleased if you could all keep an eye on these facilities and hopefully we can catch the thief that is stealing from all of us. To the thief – we now empty our boxes each day and if you are caught – we will not hesitate to prosecute you and name and shame you to all those you are stealing from.

Residents may have noticed that there is a new notice board in Spenbrook which adds character to the hamlet and means that the PC has now met its wish to renew the boards in Newchurch and Spenbrook. The boards have glass fronted doors, which means notices are now protected from the weather. There is also now a notice board in Sabden Fold, which previously did not have one. Individuals and organisations can use the boards for information notices and advertisements for their businesses but please be aware that notices concerning Parish Council business take precedence, so please do not remove them in any circumstances.

I have described previously that ash trees in Sparable Wood have been infected with ash die back disease and may well die as a result and the steps the PC wish to take to replace the dead trees. I have received notification that our application to the Woodland Trust for 420 saplings free of charge has been successful. The PC will receive them in March 2018 and then will be planted. We have already received generous offers to help with planting, which are gratefully received. Another suggestion has been made regarding donating trees, in particular in memory of a deceased loved one. All suggestions will be considered and acted on if at all possible. I have often considered that opportunities can present themselves when faced with a problem and in this case, the community can benefit as a result.

The bonfire was a success again this year and our thanks to Carl Ryder and Bob Donovan for organising it. As with many communities, it is the same people who volunteer and although our thanks go to those that are prepared to get involved, it does get wearing when others do not come forward to help. This year's results of the Best Kept Village Competition show that the hamlets of Newchurch and Spenbrook were again unplaced and although I think there is nothing obviously wrong with our hamlets, other local villages, which seem to have many more volunteers than us, were far more successful. If we want to be successful in the BKVC, as we have in past years, then our community will need to get more actively involved. Roughlee Parish Council

The big News item relates to the Bay Horse Inn. The huge effort put in by villagers to restore and reopen the pub have received extensive publicity at both local and national level. The formal opening is scheduled for the 25th November after which it is all systems go including a Christmas Day lunch. In times past the Bay Horse was famous for its Sunday lunches and this tradition will be reinstated from 26th November when Sunday Roast will be served between 12 noon and 8pm. The Parish Council and, I am sure, the whole of the village wish every success to Jack and his colleagues.

The senior citizens Christmas lunch this year is confirmed for Thursday 14th December and invitations have been sent out. If you have not received yours but would like to attend please let us know. The Mayor and Mayoress will be joining us and Roughlee School will entertain us after the meal. Something to really look forward to!

Earlier this year the Parish Council commissioned work from Lancashire Wildlife Trust to look at habitats in the Parish area. The importance of protecting and enhancing the natural areas around us, to know what species we have and how we can improve their habitats is, I think, something that most of us would agree with. The starting point is to know what we have and the first report by the Trust will address this. The report, prepared by John Lamb of the Trust, will be presented to the Parish Council meeting on 4th December when we will discuss how to take things forward. Measure could include engaging local people to observe and record plants and animals seen in the Parish area. If you are interested in looking after our countryside with its many different species of plants and animals, please join us at 7pm on the 4th December to hear the presentation and join in the discussion.

As you may have noticed from the stop press in the last Parish News, Roughlee was runner up to Barley in this year's Best Kept Village completion. Well done to Barley who won by the narrowest of margins but I know that the villagers of Roughlee will be back next year to keep up the good work. The aim is to take care of our village and the competition is a means to this end.

Openreach have been very active in and around the village over the past few weeks and we remain

hopeful that super-fast broadband will be available by Christmas as promised.

As well as events at the pub the Roughlee Village Centre committee have an exciting social calendar in the period running up to Christmas. Details are elsewhere in the News, on the website and on local notice boards. In the meantime the Parish Council wishes you all a happy and peaceful time over the Christmas and New Year celebrations.
