The Vicar's Letter

There's not really any such thing as an average day for a Vicar. There may be some days when I do the same things such as Collective Acts of Worship in the schools or services on a Sunday but in the main I don't always know what any one day will bring.

Today (19th November) has been a prime example of that. The early part of the morning saw me dealing with baptism and wedding enquiries then it was over to St Thomas Church to help put up a display about modern day slavery then a quick bite to eat and off to Roughlee Church of England school to join the children and staff for a World Toilet Day Party complete with 'poo' cupcakes (don't worry it was chocolate icing!!).

The early part of the evening will be given over to this article and answering the emails that have come in whilst I was enjoying myself at the party and getting very excited that Roughlee have now twinned one of their toilets.

People are now beginning to get excited about Christmas Day and hoping that things will be better than they were for many in 2020. Last year we were encouraged to have a simple Christmas. I love this quote from Andrew Roberts a Methodist minister writing for the Roots magazine, 'Simple need not be spartan though. I suspect the shepherds may have gone a bit wild when they went back to the hills and probably imbibed a good measure of their favourite tipple'.

In the same article Jeremiah (aged 8 years) says,' We should prepare our heart for Jesus during Advent. We should share our blessing with the homeless and those who don't have a lot'

Christmas Day 2021 may still be different from previous ones but one thing never changes, not even in the grip of a deadly pandemic we remember that on the first Christmas Day God sent the best present of all Jesus.

Heavenly Father, we embrace your call for us to make disciples, to be witnesses, to grow leaders and inspire children and young people. Give us eyes to see Your vision, ears to hear the prompting of Your Spirit and courage to follow in the footsteps of Your Son our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen
