

We are delighted to inform the Village that funds are now in place for the commencement of Phase II of our central wall & railings feature. The contractors will be starting the works in mid-November.

The artist's impression is illustrated below and the design is now all but complete. Some detail changes may occur but this is in essence how it will look when it's finished. The area will include a planted rockery which will be kindly provided by the Hartley family. A raised bus stop will also feature and we are still working on the idea of having some form of lighting. A commemorative bench in the memory of Robert Peel will be positioned there and there is still an opportunity for one more to accompany it. Please write to the Chairman if you are interested, or for a commemorative tree or bush.

At a site meeting of the new Water Works, details were given regarding its progress. The pipeline from Barley Banks to Ridgaling is now complete and the soil has been replaced. The land will be seeded in the spring and it hoped to repair hedgerows and walls in the very near future. However, new works are due to start soon on a pipeline from Thorneyholme to Whitehough which will involve temporary traffic lights. We were also informed that concrete pouring will take place in earnest in November and on several days there will be cement mixers in and out of the site outside their normal hours, ie all day from 7.30am onwards.

Signs will be erected showing the dates and additional measures will be taken to warn of oncoming vehicles.

A further round of improvements are beginning at the Hall with the replacement of remaining windows in early November. This will be followed by the installation of a completely new heating and power system, incorporating an air-source heat pump and solar panels. We will be one of the first public buildings with this combined system. It is being funded as a demonstrator by DEFRA, the Energy Saving Trust and the Forest of Bowland Sustainable Development Fund.
