Barley Parish Council Toilet block, Whitehough, Christmas events (14 Dec), Planning, Parking...

Our annual remembrance service graced us with a bright and clear day, and it was good to have over 50 people attending. It was wonderful to hear the brief histories of all those whose names appear on the Barley Memorial stone read out by Angela Hargreaves; where and when they died and how young they all were, brought to life the sacrifice they made for us. The local preacher Cath Heywood conducted the short service, and she laid a wreath on behalf of the Parish Council along with representatives of the armed forces, the Borough Council and the Pendle Inn who laid wreaths after the last post had been played on a bugle, with distinction, by our local man, Rod Wilson. Thank you to the chapel for providing tea and cakes for those retiring to the chapel after the service. The work to improve the toilet block which was going well, soon hit setbacks as layers of the building were peeled back. The building is over 50 years old, and I doubt much maintenance happened in that period until the PC started this project to upgrade the building. Some things only become obvious once you have good access and it soon became apparent that the tiles, battens and felting were far beyond their best and one of the first instructions was to renew the roof followed by another instruction to replace the windows. Being positive we now have new roofs with long guarantees that should mean I will never have to worry about it again. The new windows will delay the project completion until January, but we plan to have the toilets fully open for Xmas.



Last month I reported the improvement works carried out to the access road to Whitehough. It looks great but the new surface could

cause horses to slip and so the County Council has implemented an order to temporarily prohibit horses being either ridden or led over the Bridleway for a period of 6 months or until any necessary works are completed within this period.

At the PC we will be considering a planning application to convert a stable block at Whitehough Grange to form one dwelling – see Application 25/0682/FUL. If you have an interest you should respond to PBC by 9th December. The planning application for a glass conservatory at the rear of Meadow View on Barley Green was approved and

the application for a two-storey side extension at Bollards Barn, Whitehough is still being considered after revised plans were submitted.

Thanks to everyone who supported the Curry/Quiz night fundraiser at the Village Hall. The next event is Barley to Bethlehem starting at 5pm at the car park and the children's Christmas party both to be held on Sunday 14 December.

Cross Lane Parking Enforcement update – the formal consultation process was completed on 24th October. LCC had reported that they had received several comments and all were supportive and so a Traffic Regulation Order will now go to LCC members for sign-off. Members will pay attention to the Officers Report and the public response to the consultation.

The village community was saddened to hear of the passing of Maureen Moles who recently lived on Beckside before moving to a care home in Clitheroe. She spent most of her life in Barley living at numerous homes under pendle and was well known to many residents. Our most sincere condolences are with her daughter Cheryl Davies of Narrowgates and the wider family.

I will finish by asking you all to drive carefully now that the winter has arrived. Whilst we will see the Gritters out and about, the road surface can still freeze before they arrive. And on our rural roads we suffer from water flooding across the roadway from wet fields and washing the salt off – then freezing to create ice patches that can be a real danger. Even if you have seen a Gritter, take care, there could be ice just around the corner.

Goldshaw Booth Parish Council Light Up Newchurch (6 Dec), Maintenance, Wellbeing...

On Sunday 9th November, our community came together to show respect and gratitude for members of the armed services, past, present and future. During a poignant Remembrance Service at St Mary's Church, led by Reverend Nick Murray, Councillor Kathleen Wilkinson read out the names of local servicemen who sacrificed their lives during the First and Second World Wars, and wreaths were laid by Goldshaw Booth Parish Council, Roughlee Parish Council and Pendle Borough Council.



Our seasonal events got off to a good start with Houses of Halloween in Newchurch again being a great success. The bonfire was very well attended with approximately 100 people, and we take on board the feedback that people would have liked more refreshments —

we'll do our best to arrange that next year, in collaboration with local residents.

Food will not be in short supply at our 'Let's Light Up Newchurch' Christmas lights switch on and Santa's grotto event, as Debs Mousley has kindly offered to organise the catering! The event will be held on Saturday 6th December, at 6.30pm in Newchurch, with a super-tombola, free presents for children, and hot turkey sandwiches, mince pies and mulled wine for residents. There will be a donation box on the evening for people to give what they can, and if anyone has any tombola prizes, they would be greatly appreciated and can be dropped off at the church in advance.

We've been busy with some maintenance jobs and are pleased to have installed a new surface under the cradle swings and to have cut back all of the brambles around the top playing field, as well as around the toilet block. Thankfully the issue causing water to stream down the steps by the toilet block now seems to have been resolved following exploratory digging. Please let us know if there are any maintenance projects you would like the Parish Council to consider, so we can discuss and allocate budget funds accordingly.

Looking forward to next Spring, we are hoping to organise some outdoor wellbeing events in conjunction with Active Pendle, such as tai-chi and a park run. Again, do let us know if you have any ideas and watch this space for more information... Finally, may we take this opportunity to wish all residents a very happy, safe and peaceful Christmas and New Year.

Seniors' Xmas Lunch (11 Dec), Kids' vouchers, Forest of Pendle, Sinkhole...

The turkeys have been plucked, the spuds bashed, and the Brussels sprouts are already on the boil – which can only mean one thing: preparations are well advanced for our Seniors Christmas Lunch on Thursday 11 December. As I write, I don't yet know the final numbers, but it looks very much like we're heading for a sell out. Please do remember that walk-ins on the day cannot be accommodated. During November, we wrote to all households in the village where we believe under 16s reside, inviting them to "opt in" to receive the gift of a book token. This is our way of recognising and engaging with the youth — the future of our community. If you feel you qualify but haven't received an invitation, please get in touch with Mary so we can put that right.

We have now received an update from Pendle Planning regarding the "alleged unauthorised engineering of land – creation of 9 No. caravan pitches" by the Forest of Pendle Leisure Park, Pasture Lane. They have been issued with an enforcement notice relating to this development. The upshot of this is they are required: "to remove all caravan bases and associated roadways, re profile the land so that it matches the original contours and landform that existed prior to the engineering works and reseed the land with grass." Whilst this is good news for our countryside, I am sure that this will run for quite a period of time and we would expect the site to appeal this decision or put in further applications to regularise part of the site. So, once again watch this space.

The sinkhole on the riverbank has unfortunately worsened. Lancashire County Council has begun stabilisation work, which explains the traffic lights. We have not yet had any official indication of how long this will take or what the permanent solution will be, but we will continue to press for clarity. Looking ahead, our January meeting will focus on reviewing finances and setting the budget for the coming year, which will form the basis of our precept.

Finally, though it may be a touch early, I would like to take this opportunity to wish you all a very Merry Christmas.

Notes from St. Mary's Ready or Not!

Well, I moved to Barrowford in November 2024, and it's been a really busy year. But in and amongst the busyness I'm glad God called me here and I'm grateful for the welcome I've had from the community. I'm still finding my way to most places by satnav but gradually working out where places are. Nothing could have prepared me for the changes that have taken place in my life this last year.

And being prepared (or preparing to be prepared) is what Advent is about. It's a season of getting ready and anticipation. In truth, we are never prepared, and Christmas happens anyway. Whether or not the tree is decorated, or the turkey bought, or the cards written (though with each year I wonder why I am writing cards...), Christmas will still come. And for some of us it means excitement, for some it means dread and for some it could really be done to be avoided because we would rather not see some family members... But it happens anyway regardless of how we prepare.

This year the church will be reflecting on Matthew's gospel. Matthew starts his good news (gospel means good news) with a big list of names. These names trace the history of the Old Testament and culminate with Jesus' birth. Matthew is making a huge claim. He is claiming that all history and all these people were in some way preparation for the moment when Jesus was born.

In the list of names there are people who were successful, and adject failures, people who had muddled along, and people you would have done well to avoid. The list of names in Jesus' family tree doesn't shy away from some uncomfortable truths and some people who you wouldn't want around your Christmas dinner table. Mathew asserts that in the birth of Jesus, which the world wasn't ready for, is the one in whom we are offered a fresh start and a new beginning. All the hurt and failure of the past, all those false starts and unfulfilled longings, all the shame that we carry with us. These are like a long list (like the names in Jesus' family tree) which weigh us down and hold us back. But into all of that lived reality steps Jesus and he brings with him a new start which we can all have if we give him our hurts, failures, success, fears and shame.

At the end of Matthew's gospel Jesus promises to return. Since then, the world has been waiting. All history is again building towards that day when Jesus will come again and make all things new. My invitation this Advent is to not let your past prevent you from stepping into the new life, the fresh start that Jesus brings.

I look forward to seeing you in Church this Christmas.
